














Sarajevo endured the longest siege in Modern History between 1992-1995. At the crossroad bewteen East and West, the city stood as an example of peaceful multiethnic co-existence at the heart of Europe. When the war broke out the city became the frontline zone with civilians and fighters living side by side, struggling for survival. Beyond survival the people stood up for their city and their resistance appeared to be as much political, artistic as military.

With uncovered archives and rare testimonies, the film is a revealing account of this siege and defining moment in History as told by those who experienced it first hand. A universal story of war and resistance, 20 years after the Dayton Agreements finally settled peace in Ex-Yougoslavia.
